The Inclusive Digital Glossary is a multilingual educational resource designed to support a shared understanding of key concepts related to inclusion and diversity. It is the result of a collaborative process carried out during the student mobilities: in each mobility, students and teachers worked together on specific thematic areas, identifying relevant terminology, discussing meanings, and developing clear and accessible definitions.

The selected terms were then translated into the partner languages — English, French, Greek, Icelandic, Italian, Spanish, and Turkish — ensuring accessibility and intercultural relevance. Each term is presented with a concise definition and its equivalents, enabling users to develop both conceptual understanding and linguistic awareness.

Beyond its function as a vocabulary resource, the glossary is a pedagogical tool that promotes active learning, intercultural dialogue, and student engagement. It is intended for students, teachers, and educational stakeholders, as a practical reference for teaching, learning, and awareness-raising activities.

Bullying

Bullying is a significant issue within educational environments that negatively affects students' well-being, academic performance, and social development. It refers to repeated behaviors intended to harm, intimidate, or exclude an individual, and can take various forms, including physical, verbal, social, and digital. Addressing bullying is essential for creating safe, inclusive, and respectful learning spaces. Within the WIFII project, the topic of bullying was explored during student mobilities, particularly in Palermo, Italy, through collaborative discussions and activities. Students and teachers worked together to identify key concepts related to bullying, reflect on personal and social experiences, and develop a shared understanding of the terminology associated with this issue. The result is a multilingual vocabulary that supports awareness, prevention, and intervention strategies in educational contexts.

School Drop-out

School drop-out is a complex educational and social issue that refers to the early leaving of education before the completion of compulsory or upper secondary schooling. It is influenced by a combination of factors, including personal, social, economic, and academic challenges. Within the WIFII project, this topic was explored through collaborative work during student mobilities, specifically in Córdoba, Spain, where participants examined the causes, consequences, and possible prevention strategies related to early school leaving. Students and teachers identified key concepts such as family background, economic reasons, psychological support, expectations, and academic performance, highlighting the multifaceted nature of the phenomenon. This section aims to support a deeper understanding of school drop-out by providing clear definitions and multilingual terminology, while also promoting awareness of the importance of inclusive educational practices, support systems, and early intervention measures.

In contemporary educational contexts, it is essential to promote awareness, respect, and inclusion of diverse gender identities in order to create safe and supportive learning environments for all students. Within the WIFII project, the topic of gender identity was explored through collaborative activities during student mobilities, especially in Akranes, Iceland, where participants engaged in discussions aimed at understanding diversity, equality, and inclusion. Students and teachers worked together to identify key concepts such as non-binary identity, sexual orientation, equality, and support, reflecting the importance of recognizing and respecting individual differences. This section aims to provide clear definitions and multilingual terminology that support inclusive education and foster respect, empathy, and equal opportunities for all individuals, regardless of their gender identity.

Within the WIFII project, intergenerational link was a central theme explored through student mobilities, especially in Tourcoing, France, and collaborative activities, where participants engaged directly with concepts such as transmission, solidarity, collective memory, and shared experiences. Students and teachers worked together to identify key terms related to elderly care, social interaction, and support systems, highlighting the importance of building meaningful connections across generations. This section aims to provide clear definitions and multilingual terminology that support the development of inclusive practices, encourage active participation of both young and older individuals, and promote a culture of respect, empathy, and lifelong learning.
